- Michelle explained that Tiger Growth sessions will be held during parent/teacher conferences. Each grade level has a specific area of focus for their students. For example, first grade is working on addition and subtraction. At Tiger Growth sessions, parents and teachers will develop a goal for their child on this skill, and they will be sent home with a game to practice. The 1% budget will help pay for the resources that are sent home to help with this skill.
